Minutes

MLK Update

Audrey reported that postcards were sent out and some came back. Roberta said more things are coming back than normally happens. Olga said there is some activity on the website and some people are adding their email addresses. Jenny mentioned that the mobile site is awful. Olga will try to figure out why our website isn't getting picked up by search engines. Meredith talked about the Ambassadors, who are a group of seven people working on the MLK Master Plan. They have been meeting since December. They are working on art selection, developing content for interpretation, fundraising and marketing. They will develop a site for fundraising so we can accept Venmo, Apple Pay, etc. They are close to having some designs ready. They are also having conversations with large donors. The State sent the contract for the four million dollars. They will give an overview to the City Council tonight.

Meredith's Report

Meredith reported that summer camps start next week. There are enhanced scholarship opportunities. The tennis courts and pickleball courts at Cloverland Park are open. Olga asked if the camping situation is improving. Meredith said it is approaching pre-COVID levels. They have to prioritize which camps to post and then clean up.
